

## 2021 Track and Field State Meet Results-Girls

I am immensely proud of the effort put forth by our Boys and Girls Track and Field teams at the GHSA State Championships, held at McEachern High School this past week.

Despite losing one of our top athletes in prelims to an injury, our girls team finished 7<sup>th</sup> in 7-AAAAAAA, and were one of two Gwinnett County team (Peachtree Ridge finished 2<sup>nd</sup> overall) in the top 10.

Our Girls State medal winners this season were:

Girls 4x800: 5<sup>th</sup> place. Macy Felton, Trinity Thurman, Emma Rhodes, and Allie Wardle

Girls 400 meter: 4<sup>th</sup> place-Madison Campbell. (Serena Tate qualified in prelims, but was injured in the 200 and did not race in the finals)

Girls 100 hurdles: 3<sup>rd</sup> place-Veajah Hylton

Girls 800 meter: 5<sup>th</sup> place- Allie Wardle

Girls 200 meter: 7<sup>th</sup> place-Madison Campbell

Girls 300 hurdles: 1<sup>st</sup> place and STATE CHAMPION: Aliyah Irving

Girls 300 hurdles: 6<sup>th</sup> place: Kylin Beard

Girls 300 hurdles: 7<sup>th</sup> place: Veajah Hylton

Girls 4x400 relay: 8<sup>th</sup> place: Jasmine Johnson, Aliyah Irving, Allie Wardle, Madison Campbell

-Madison Campbell's time in the 400 during prelims (56:09) is the new BHS School Record, breaking Susan Crisp's record of 56:34 from 1985(!) Serena Tate tied Crisp's time during prelims as well.

-Aliyah Irving's state championship run time of 44.14 lowers her school record. Aliyah is Brookwood's first state champion in the 300 hurdles!

-Veajah Hylton is the first girl in the BHS history to qualify for finals in both the 100 and 300 hurdles in the same season.

-Almost the entire State team from this season will be returning in 2022. Be ready to see amazing things from this group in 2022.
